HISTORY OF THE CATHEDRAL

On June 15, 1936, during the period of the Great Depression, Christ the King parish was established on a four-acre site in the community of Buckhead—at that time, located outside the city limits of Atlanta and at the end of the trolley line. The cost of the property was \$35,000.

Situated on the property was an elegant Greek Revival mansion. The porch of this mansion was used for the first parish Mass offered by newly appointed pastor, Father Joseph P. Moylan on August 15, 1936.

Groundbreaking for the new church and school began almost immediately. The cornerstone for the church was blessed on October 31, 1937, the Feast of Christ the King. The solemn dedication of Christ the King Church took place on January 18, 1939.

The church building itself is of French Gothic architectural style, designed by the Philadelphia-based firm of Henry D. Dagit. Indiana limestone, Stone Mountain granite and Georgia marble were used in the construction of the Church and school buildings. *Architectural Record* chose the Cathedral as the “most beautiful building in Atlanta”.

Seating would be for 700—remarkable foresight since the parish family numbered only 400. (Membership today is just under 5000 families and growing—one of the ten largest Cathedral parishes in the country.)

As parish membership mushroomed, the physical plan was expanded—in 1953 the school building was doubled in size and convent built. In 1962, the long-awaited gymnasium was completed and named the Hyland Center in honor of the first Bishop of Atlanta.

The years 1999-2000 brought the construction of a three-story Parish Center building, major renovations and additions to the school buildings and a three-story parking deck.

The school, originally consisting of a co-ed grammar school and an all girl high school, now serves over 500 students in grades kindergarten through eighth.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION & PROCESSES

Sacraments

Sacraments are vital expressions of who we are as Catholic Christians. Each time we receive a sacrament we respond in a deeper way to Jesus' call to discipleship. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists the sacraments as follows: "The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic sacrifice and the sacraments. There are seven sacraments in the Church: *Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony.*"

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptism is the first Sacrament celebrated in the process of becoming a full member of the Church community. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Baptism is, like all the sacraments, a gift from God. Water is the universal symbol. Water is absolutely essential for all life. Water cleanses and restores. It is the waters of Baptism which give us new life. In accordance, through Baptism we also die to our old sinful selves in order to be restored and resurrected in the new life of Christ.

Sacrament of First Reconciliation & First Eucharist

The forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism is conferred by a particular sacrament called the sacrament of conversion, confession, penance, or reconciliation. To return to communion with God after having lost it through sin is a process born of the grace of God who is rich in mercy and solicitous for the salvation of men. "I have swept away your transgressions like a cloud, and your sins like mist; return to me, for I have redeemed you." (Isaiah 44:22).

"The Most Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, and this sacrament completes Christian initiation. The Most Holy Eucharist is the most august sacrament, in which Christ the Lord himself is contained, offered and received, and by which the Church constantly lives and grows..." Canon Law 897.

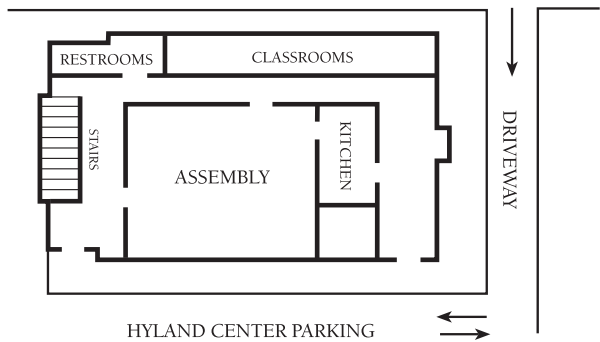
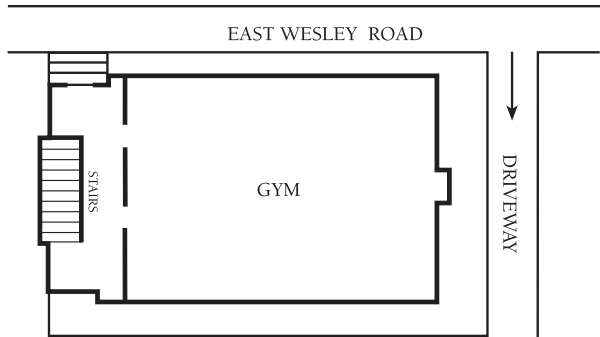
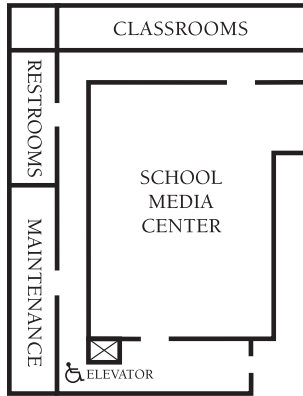
CATHEDRAL FLOOR PLANS

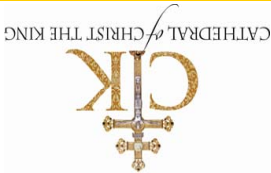
